*(Payment ideally be made on the day, agreements around cost of puppies, number of puppies, breeding terms re return of any puppies to the stud dog owner should be firmly agreed and detailed here. Delay in making payment can result in disagreement and circumstances changing making payment difficult and potentially disputed.)*

**Pre mating** – consider worming - vet check – health tests and bloods for the bitch to determine best time for the mating.

**Timing of Matings – Health Tests** This depends on the bitch owner and the ability to predict the best time to achieve optimum results this can be dependent on lab results and can be a tricky time, so it is important to have a relationship between owners that allows some flexibility. Both dog and bitch need to be in good health, have had the agreed tests (for Boxers Heart testing essential, kidney function recommended, hips, eyes optional but available. *(further information re the above tests can be found on the Breed Council website and Kennel Club website, also from your own vet.)*

**Post Mating** – keep the animals routines as usual as possible, be observant of the bitch she may be off her food, try not to give anything out of the ordinary – there are different views re medications/worming and vaccinations at this time, you will need to consult your vet and other experienced breeders to help you make sensible decisions around this.

Once puppies are born keep health records and continue to do this with all the puppies for at least the first few years of their life (periodically being in touch with owners).
